The appointment was announced by Clann Credo's Chairperson, Colin McCrea, who said 'I am delighted to announce this appointment. Mary is an established leader in the community and voluntary sector for over nineteen years and has a proven track record of delivering results for clients and stakeholders. Her appointment reflects our ambition to

The second event focused on adapting community facilities for people working at home. There are several reasons remote workers look for workspaces outside the home, for example:

To support this, the campaign will develop tailored training for the sector to upskill staff and volunteers in the areas of effective communications and storytelling.
